About the College

Rural Sonai area encompasses huge are covering Bhuban Hill to Sonabarighat and Binnakandi to Palonghat. But this bigger region did not have any institution of higher education and vo the local students had to opt for the colleges of Silchar town. Most of the guardians with smaller income could not afford to send their wards to Silchar, and the wards of the few affordable guardians had most often to come back disappointed getting no scope to get admitted to the college of choice. It appeared as a grave problem for the whole area which drew the attention of some noble minds and so they came forward to effect a permanent solution. On one sunny morning in the early seventies of the previous century those altruistic group of persons got together amidst mass participation and after elaborate discussion and exchange of views the historic resolution to set up a college was unanimously adopted. The long cherished dream of the people, thus, came to be translated into reality.

To give practical shape to the adopted resolution, the leading stalwarts invested their all- out efforts that ultimately resulted in getting the foundation stone of the proposed college building laid on the memorable 28 day of August 1972 by the proverbial teaching giant and strict administrator (now no more) Sri Haripada Bhattacharjee - the then Principal of G. C. College, Silchar. It would be wise to respectfully remember those high-souled sons of the soil but for whose sincere service the dream of a college would have remained far beyond the encircled limit of reality. The College was at first christened as "Sonai College" but it had to be rechristened as Madhab Chandra Das College after the lavish-handed donor of the same name donated Rs. 15,000/- in cash-a considerably bigger sum for that time in addition to the plot of land on which the East Block of the college building stands. The plot of land on which the West Block stands was of course, donated by Late Kala Mia Mazumder and others.

The college began its journey with only a few students in both H.S. and degree level at the N.G.H.S. School building in the morning shift. The classes were permanently shifted in 1975 to the present site with Alhaj Tajamul Ali Mazumder as the Principal who did immensely to manage the affairs of the College through all odd situations with his habitual boldness and administrative dexterity.

The college first got affiliated to the Gauhati University in 1980-81 and the government of Assam was pleased to bring it under Deficit System of Grants- in-Aid in 1985. However, when the Assam University came into existence, the college came under its affiliation in 1994. Subsequently U.G.C.'s 2(F) and 12(B) status was granted to the college in 1997 and with this the college became officially competent to enjoy monetary grants from U.G.C. On its way to gradual advancement the college now can boast of having all the three streams of study in its fold, though its sojourn began with only Arts stream. The year 2004 turned out to be a significant milestone in the college history. In that year the Peer Team of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) under the chairmanship of Dr. Basudeb Chatterjee visited the college and accredited it with B-grade status. After a long gap of almost 12 years, the college again assessed by the NAAC peer team during 27 to 29th September 2016 under the chairmanship of Prof. Bhoomittra Dev and accredited the college with CGPA of 2.01 on seven point scale at B Grade

COURSES OF STUDIES

HIGHER SECONDARY COURSE (ARTS AND COMMERCE)

Two year Higher Secondary Course in Arts and Commerce provided in the College are governed by the rules and regulations of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC). The course comprises two examination, viz., (i) First Year & (ii) Final Year. Promotion to 2nd year or Final Year depends on the successful completion of First Year examination conducted by the Council.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

For seeking admission to the first year Higher Secondary Course, a candidate must have passed H.S.L.C. Examination of SEBA or Secondary Examination conducted by different recognised State Board & Central Board of India.

COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS:

- I. H.S. ARTS:
- (A) Core Subjects:
- 1) English
- ii) Environmental Education
- iii) Any one from MIL-Bengali/ Manipuri & Alternative English

B) Elective Subjects:

Any three of the following subjects are to be chosen:

- Economics
- Political Science
- History
- Logic & Philosophy
- Advance Bengali
- Advance Manipuri

- Arabic
- Persian.

N.B.: Two language subjects cannot be chosen simultaneously.

II. H.S. COMMERCE

(A) Core Subjects:

- i) English
- ii) Environmental Education
- iii) Any one MIL-Bengali/ Manipuri Hind Alternative English

(B) Elective Subjects:

Any three of the following subjects are to be chosen:

- Accountancy
- Business Studies
- Economics
- Commercial Arithmetic & Elements of Statistics.

Additional/Optional Subjects: One of the elective subjects may be offered as Additional/Optional subject in addition to three elective subjects. Optional/Additional subject carries no extra benefit of marks but will be considered elective subject in case a student fails in any one of the elective subjects.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTIONS:

The medium of instructions shall be English except programmes/ courses/ subjects/ topics in Modern Indian Languages.

UNIT TESTS/EXAMINATIONS

After completion of each unit/chapter the teacher will assess the achievement of each student and inform the score/grade of achievement to student with suggestion for follow up activities. In addition to this two Unit Tests will be conducted as per schedule mentioned below.

FOUR-YEAR DEGREE COURSE - SEMESTER SYSTEM (Under NEP 2020) BA, BSc & BCom

(As per the General Guidelines & Regulations of Assam University)

Candidates for admission to the FIRST SEMESTER of FYUG shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary (+2) or its equivalent Examinations conducted by any recognized University/ Board/ Council.

COURSES:

Course in simple terms corresponds to one Paper under a particular 'Subject'. Multiple subjects constitute a programme of study. Courses in a programme of study may be of 08 (Eight) types viz.,

- a) Discipline Specific Core (DSC): This is the course a core requirement to complete a programme in a specific discipline of study.
- **b)** Discipline Specific Minor (DSM): From Discipline Specific Minor (DSM), Students shall take two subjects related to his/her Discipline.
- c) Interdisciplinary Course (IDC): Three interdisciplinary courses i.e. IDC-101, IDC-151 and IDC-201 with 3(three) credits each shall be studied in the entire FYUG programme in First Semester, Second Semester and Third Semester respectively. There are 04 baskets viz: Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I, II and III semester. Bunching of subjects in each basket shall be as per Annexure-II.
- d) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): Ability Enhancement Courses are the

compulsory courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

- **e) Skill Enhancement Course** (**SEC**): SEC Courses opted in 1st Semester shall remain same for all three semesters. SECs are the compulsory value-based and/or skill-based aimed at providing hands-on-training, skills, etc. SEC shall have to be opted from either DSC or from DSM-1.
- **f)** Value Added Course (VAC): This is common to all FYUG students of 1st and 2nd Semester. The college is offering VAC courses as NSS and NCC. Environmental Studies (EVS) are the compulsory course in second semester for all streams.
- **g)Dissertation/ Project:** Dissertation/ Project Work is a special course for students with Honours and Research.

h)Internship: This is a compulsory 2 credit Course for 5th Semester students of all Disciplines under FYUG programme

ATTENDANCE

To appear as regular candidate a student must attend at least 75% of the classes held in the college. No students shall be allowed to appear at the final examination if he/she fails to attend the requisite number of classes as laid down by the Council/University. At least 60% attendance is necessary to appear at the examination. Attendance below 60% will render a student dis-collegiate and such students are not eligible to appear at the council/university examination.

UNIFORM

The students must attend college wearing full college uniform. As per the decision of the governing body students are free to purchase from the market. The students must maintain the following dress code while coming to college regularly.

SCHOLARSHIP

The college provides scholarships to students belonging to SC/ST/OBC and Minority groups from the UGC and MSDP funds. Students belonging to SC/ST/OBC receive scholarship under the UGC scheme. The Minority students receive scholarship under MSDP scheme sponsored by the Government. The students may apply for National Scholarship; Essan Uday Scholarship; SC, ST, OBC/MOBC Scholarship provided they fulfil the requisite qualification as laid down by the concerned authority from time to time. The college also provides house rent and conveyance allowance to students belonging to economically weaker sections subject to the receipt of UGC fund for the purpose.

DISCIPLINE

The college maintains a high standard of discipline. The students must abide by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college authority. Any violation of college rules & regulations will invite strict disciplinary action such as forced transfer, non-issuing of college certificates or any other punishment the authority deems fit and proper. The principal's decision shall be final and binding on all.

FACILITIES AVAILABLE

LIBRARY

The MCD College library was established in the year 1972 along with the college establishment and started functioning in the very same year. The glimpses of the library are the following:

- 1. Library Users: Students: 1250; Teachers: 20; Non-teaching Staff: 08. Also opened to non-institutional members like research scholars, academicians, Ex-teachers and locals.
- 2. Library Staff: 2 including librarian.
- 3. Library Hours: 9.30 am to 4.30 pm.
- 4. Library System: Open Access System where library users can browse books in the stack & issue.

6. Computerization: Library having Local Area Network (LAN) with 8 computers with Server. Complete database of books is available through OPAC. Automation is completed with SOUL software provided by INFLIBNET Center, Ahmedabad.

7. Library Sections:

- a) Stack section: Here, the main collection of the college in the form of Text Books is kept. The number of volumes is nearly 12,600 at present. Due to open access system, students and teachers are free to visit the stack area to select their own choice.
- **b) Reference Section:** Here, the rare and valuable collection is kept as reference source. Nearly 1000 volumes of valuable books are there for use by various categories of users like renowned personalities, resource persons, research scholars and university and college students.
- **c) Periodical Section:** This section contains almost 10 periodicals ranging from research level, career opportunities and popular magazine.
- d) Newspaper Section: This section houses 5 nos. of newspaper.
- **e) N-LIST Programme:** The College is now having the latest INFLIBNET Programme called National Library & information Service of Scholarly Content (N-LIST) through which more than 6100 e-journals (including current issues with 5-10 years back files) and more than 97,000 + e-books are accessible for any user using login ID and Password. Students are allowed to use this facility from the Central Library.
- f) N.E. Block: This Section is having Micro Literature of North-Eastern Regions.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The college has its own mouthpiece named 'PRANTASHREE that continues to see the light of the day since 1973. It is a tetra-lingual magazine in which contributions are made in all the four languages of English, Bengali, Manipuri and Hindi.

HOSTEL

The College is having its two-storeyed Girls' Hostel. The girls students enrolled in this college may avail the facility.

AUDITORIUM

At present the spacious ground floor of a three-storey building is being temporarily used as auditorium. The temporary auditorium is equipped with comfortable seating arrangement, digital podium, LCD projectors etc. The college is on the way of receiving a considerable amount of grants from the state government for infrastructural development under which a well equipped auditorium is proposed to be constructed.

COMMON ROOM

Separate common rooms for boys' and girls' stand on the east block of the college where provisions for some common indoor games such as Carrom, Chess, Ludo, Chinese Checker, etc. have been made so that the students during their off-period might enjoy useful relaxation.

CANTEEN

The canteen is under construction.

OTHER INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES

One of the unique achievernents of the institution is the construction of a 'Smart Class' equipped with up- to-date technology of education. A separate departmental chamber for teachers' has been constructed having up-to-date facilities. In order to enable the students to use high speed internet service, the college campus has been made Wi-Fi enabled. The entire campus has been brought under CC camera surveillance. Principal's room, teachers' common room and the library have been provided with LCD TV. A number of computers have been installed in the college with LAN connection. In order to provide safe & pure drinking water facility, a water cooler with considerable capacity has been installed for the students.
