#### ANNEXURE 02

#### **Achievements**

#### Improvement of Infrastructure

- (a) The College can boast of the huge grant received from the UGC for construction of a three storied Indoor Sports Building. Out of the total grant of Rs. 70.00 lakh for construction of the Sports Building Rs. 35.00 lakh has been released by the UGC during the current session. Accordingly tenders were invited from competent contractor and work order was given to the highest bidder as per procedure. The foundation stone was laid on in the presence of the local MLA and other dignitaries. The progress of the work is highly satisfactory and expected to be completed. The construction of this sports building is undoubtedly a great achievement of the College in the infrastructural arena by 2012-2013.
- (b) The College has received a grant of Rs. 8, 10,000.00 from the DHE, Assam for construction of a new library building. Tenders were also invited from competent contractor for the construction of the library building and the highest bidder was allocated the construction work. The construction is going smoothly and is expected to be completed towards the end of the session. The new library building has solved a longstanding requirement of a well furnished library building.
- (c) A new class room has been constructed on the 1st floor of the Administrative building. This is a new addition to the existing infrastructure.
- (d) As proposed towards the beginning of the session construction of three numbers of laboratories for Physics, Chemistry and Biology have been completed. The Science Stream of the College (self financing course) will now comfortably run practical classes in the well-equipped laboratories.
- (e) The construction of a additional RCC class room has been initiated in the East Block of the College. The new construction of the Class Room will solve the shortage of class room consequent upon the increasing trend in the enrollment of the College.

#### Improvement of teaching method and aids:

a. Librarian was appointed on the 1<sup>st</sup> March of 2012. The post was lying vacant previously.

- b. During the session 2011-2012 the following items/equipments have been purchased all of which are directly or indirectly released with the improvement of entire teaching process of the institutions. The newly purchased items are as follows:
- 1. One no. of 25 KVA Generator set Costing Rs. 4, 06,500.00
- 2. One no. of Projects Costing Rs. 58,500.00
- 3. Three nos. of laptop Costing Rs. 85,080.00
- 4. One Microsoft Windows Server Rs. 55, 00.00
- 5. Two nos. of 600 VA UPS.
- 6. One no. of 500 GB External Hard Disk.
- (b) Internet Connectivity-

Broad band Connectivity has been provided to Principal's room and IQAC which improved communication facilities of the administration and the IQAC.

- (c) NCC unit has been set up i the College for the first time with due permission from his concerned authority. the performance of the cadres of the newly opened wing in their maiden bid has received high acclamation from the central command.
- (d) Remedial Coaching Classes for SC/ST Minority Committees. The programme is funded by the UGC and Rs. 1, 92,000.00 has been spent for this special programme during the current session.
- (e) Certificate Course in Functional English is a continuation of the programme conducted since 2010.
