6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

To give a practical shape of the concept of “man making education” enshrined in the Gandhian philosophy and facilitate rural students especially the SC, St and minorities and above all the rural female learners to have access to higher education, the founding fathers invested their all out efforts that initially resulted in getting the foundation stone of the College laid on the 28th day of August 1972. Since then the College has the sustained vision of providing access to higher education to the students of the rural community who were devoid of academic faculties of their urban counterpart. The College Also cherishes a vision of providing access to higher education to the women of this remote part of Barak Valley, backward both from the economic and educational point of view. The College can now boast of reaching its desired goal as the present boy-girl student ratio continues to be in favour of girl students. The existing boy-girl student ratio is 48:52 which is undoubtedly a conspicuous achievement of a rural institution located in an area steeped in poverty, ignorance and illiteracy.

The vision and mission of the College can be summarised as follows;-

- To transform in to action the concept of “man making education”
- To impart quality education among the rural students by inculcating the moral and aesthetic aspect of education.
- To extend every possible assistance to students belonging to the non creamy layer to get them established in the prevailing extremely competitive society.
- To fight against discrimination based on gender, language and religion and help establishing a harmonious and enlighten society of mutual co existence.
- To help its students to discover and tap their dormant potential to become properly integrated personalities who will emerge as responsible and productive citizen of the country.

Achievements

Improvement of infrastructure

- a. The construction of the Indoor Sports Building has nearly been completed except painting and some minor works. The three storied building has added beauty to the existing College premises.
- b. A well equipped IQAC room has been constructed. The room is provided with internet facility highly necessary for conducting the activities of the cell.
- c. A RCC class room has been constructed in the East Block with provision for construction of 1st and 2nd floor at the earliest possibility.
- d. 10 nos. of Steel made chair and 08 nos. of almirah have been purchased. The Teachers' Common Room have been provided with 10 nos. of chair.

Improvement of teaching method and aids.

- a. In the very beginning of the session advertisement was made for appointment of full-fledged Principal of the College and Dr. Baharul Islam Laskar, former Associate Prof. in the Deptt. of Economics, Govt. Aizawl West College was appointed as full-fledged principal of the College.
- b. Consequent upon the sudden and pre-matured death of the Jr. Asstt. of the College the post fell vacant. To fill up the vacancy advertisement was made and a new Jr. Asstt. has been appointed. The appointment has redressed the crisis of employee for the concerned table of the College office.
- c. The College use to publish its Annual mouthpiece 'Prantashree' regularly baring a few exceptions owing to unavoidable circumstances. The College magazine for the current session was published in due time. The magazine of the current session is voluminous and bears an attractive look as sufficient fund was provided by the state govt. for the prestigious publication.
- d. The College received a grant of Rs. 2.00 lakh from the state govt. to undertake educational tour. Arrangement was made accordingly for trip to Shillong, the Capital of Meghalay. A team

comprising 40 students and 5 teachers undertook a two-day trip to Shillong, the enchanting city of the North-East. The team visited Cherapunji and some other tourist spots of Meghalaya.

e. The annual sports and youth festival were arranged towards the end of December amidst enthusiastic participation of the students in various sports events. The whole College had a festive look during the three-day youth festival.
